## Rob Snowhite's Damselfly nymph C. M. Smolka



Hook: Saber 7051 or 7251 Shrimp & Caddis Pupa or Tiemco 2457 Size #10

Thread: Uni 6/0 Red

Tail: Multi color Krystal flash

Eyes: Beaded chain: (Home Depot – ceiling fan area – 12 feet for \$6.00 – enough for 36 dozen flies)

Body: Ostrich plume - chartreuse, white

1. Crush the barb, mount the hook in the vise, and start the thread an eye length rearward of the hook eye

- 2. Cut two beads from the chain and secure atop the hook shank using figure 8 wraps and a drop of super glue leaving the thread behind the eyes
- 3. Lay three pieces of flash between the eyes extending 1" rearward and secure with a couple of thread wraps
- 4. Lay five pieces of ostrich plume between the eyes tips facing rearward the same length as the flash and secure with a couple of wraps.
- 5. Fold the ostrich plume butts toward the rear, wrap rearward to the barb of the hook and back forward to behind the eye
- 6. Palmer the ostrich plume forward, figure 8 around the eyes and three turns behind eyes, secure with a couple of wraps and trim the butt ends of the ostrich plume.
- 7. Wrap the thread forward over the eyes to the hook eye and create a red head. Whip finish and varnish head.
- 8. White is also effective.
