

Pictured is the Triple Dungeon, but the recipe is the same.

Standard size

Rear hook: Daiichi 2461 #2 (or Core C2461 #2 / MFC 7050 #2 / Gamakatsu B10S #2 / Ahrex TP610 #1)

Tail: marabou (I prefer blood quill) + optional flashabou

Body (option 1): medium antron chenille + schlappen + wire Body (option 2): ice dub in dubbing loop + schlappen + wire

Body (option 3): polar chenille

Legs: pair of rubber/silicone legs of complimentary color

Wing (optional, but I always include): marabou

Connection (option 1): 19 strand wire with one bead

Connection (option 2): cut 23mm shank Connection (option 3): custom shank

Front hook: Daiichi 2461 #1/0 (or Core C2461 #1/0 / MFC 7050 #1/0 / Gamakatsu B10S #1/0 /

Ahrex TP610 #2/0)

Skirt: marabou + optional flashabou

Body (option 1): medium antron chenille + schlappen + wire Body (option 2): ice dub in dubbing loop + schlappen + wire

Body (option 3): polar chenille

Legs: three rubber/silicone legs of complimentary color

Wing (optional): marabou

Eyes: large double pupil lead eyes

Collar + head: Deer belly hair / spinning deer hair

Mini Dungeon

Downsize hooks to Daiichi 2461 #4 and #6 Use a single rubber leg on rear and two up front Small double pupil eyes instead of large

Triple Dungeon

Daiichi #6, #2, #2/0 All else is the same as standard Dungeon

Alternate Head

Instead of deer hair, you can use strung fuzzy fiber blended with Hedron's wing n' flash to achieve a head that sinks better and pushes water.

Notes

- The MFC 7050 and Core C2461 are the same hook as the Daiichi 2461, just with different manufacturers.
- The Daiichi 2460 is the same as the 2461, but with a gold finish rather than black.
- Kelly Galloup ties his Dungeons with the ice dub body option, but uses polar chenille on them for when more flash is needed (such as low light scenarios).
- Favorite colors: olive over yellow; black; olive; grizzly white; peach
